

ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION

Spare Parts was founded in 2011 as a response to the lack of arts funds and resources in PreK-12 classrooms. From 2011-2016 Spare Parts was able to distribute art supplies supplies to over **100,000** PreK-12 students through the "Fine Arts Fair" program.

In 2018 Spare Parts officially became a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization (Friends of Spare Parts) with the set mission to "Advance reuse and sustainability through creativity and the arts."

In April 2021 the Spare Parts Center for Creative Reuse opened to the public. The purpose of the Center for Creative Reuse is to facilitate the intake of pre-owned creative materials and supplies that would otherwise be thrown away or underutilized and offers them back into the community through program offerings and storefront.

The Center for Creative Reuse is a community driven operation and depends on material donors, volunteers, and patrons to continue to sustain a safe and welcoming social gathering place where teachers, parents, crafters, kids, and artists, can access affordable pre-loved supplies and materials.



FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear community,

I have personally witnessed the Center for Creative Reuse evolve over the past fours years in different roles, from board member to Administrator most recently in 2023. Starting in 2024, I am honored to serve as **Executive Director** for Spare Parts.

Back in January 2020, the Spare Parts Board of Directors made it a goal to establish San Antonio's first Creative Reuse Center. Before the retail space was even found, summer craft "survival" kits were sold online and hand delivered to homes all around San Antonio. After the lease for our Wetmore space was signed in September 2020, the team (mostly volunteers) hit the ground running. We took in donations, processed them, and got them ready for the sales floor. We then repeated this processes a few hundred times or so, give or take.

All that hard work has paid off, as the Center for Creative Reuse now generates enough revenue to not only sustain the organization, but allows us to give back even more through our programming and special events. Another milestone that took place in 2023 was being able to hire our first part-time staff at the Center for Creative Reuse.

It's amazing how far we have come as an organization that was created out of necessity over 10 years ago, and at the same time, I can tell this is just the beginning.



2023 INCOME

Over 85 percent of our revenue comes from the patrons who shop at the Center for Creative Reuse. This allows us to operate and cover expenses necessary for growth. Workshops and our Spare Parts Connect program help advance our mission and provide educational opportunities to the community.

We hosted a Summer Sidewalk Sale that allowed patrons to name their price on select items. In September, we held our first ever Silent Auction to kick-off The Big Give.


EXPENSES FRIENDS OF SPARE PARTS

2023 EXPENSES

Over 50 percent of our expenses goes towards qualified, trained, and dedicated staff that are integral to operations.

In 2023 we hired our first part-time Center Associates who help run check-out, assist patrons with finding items, and help receive and weigh donations.

WHERE WILL NET REVENUE GO?

The 2024 board of directors will determine how best to utilize the net revenue earned in 2023 that advances the organization's mission and serves the community.

Emergency fund: Some of the funds will be set aside into an emergency fund to help cover 3-6 months in operating costs in the event of an emergency or disaster so that we can continue to operate with no issues.

Reinvestment: The board will carefully determine how the funds can be used to reinvest into the organization in such a way that allows us to expand and provide our services to a larger portion of the underserved San Antonio community. This might including hiring more staff, upgrading supplies and equipment, scholarships, and expansion related expenses.


